Detecting Day out at Waldringfield

To be held on Sunday 5 September, 10.00 am to 4.00 pm. Need to be there from 09.00 am to be sure of a parking space.

Entrance fee £10 to be paid on the day, or at the club meeting. Open to all. Car parking is behind the Maybush Pub at a cost of £5.00 for a day's parking, or £1.00 for three hours.

The Maybush also provides take away food from April 1st and can be enjoyed outside or in your vehicle depending on the weather. Cold drinks will be on sale.

The detectable land consists of all grass meadowland amounting to about 39 acres which is all next to the river Deben. This land has never been detected so no one has any idea what is there. The landowner asked me to test the ground for digging which I did on the 13th July, every target was diggable and a few modern coins came to light. I was only there for about half an hour.

As is usual finds can be recorded and photographed by myself, anything of value above £500.00 can be shared with landowner and of course the terms concerning treasure items apply. We want everyone to enjoy a good day out with all the fun and skills of metal detecting.

Location of fields:

The direction is opposite The Maybush. Waldringfield. Follow the path past Marks's boat yard for about 100 yards then follow the footpath to the right which is another 200 yards to the site. This will be signposted on the day. This is alongside the river, past all the houses until you reach the wildlife marsh. There will be a sign showing the way. You will see a marquee and I will be there to greet everyone.

All profits from the day will go to St Elizabeth Hospice.
